How many students will be accepted into the program for this year?

This always depends upon the number of current grade 6 students who decide to continue through into grade 7. It is likely that there will be approximately 15-19 spots available for new students.

Can students start the program in Grade 7, or do they have to begin in Grade 6?

Students new to The Wheelhouse can begin in either grade 6 or grade 7.

How are students selected to be in the program?

Students will be accepted in the order of their registration, as long as space is still available in the program. A waitlist will be created for those who are not initially offered a place. There may always be situations where students move out of town, change their mind about the program, etc. which can then open up spots to those on the waitlist.
