Dear interested students and their families,

Making the decision to be a student in The Wheelhouse might feel like a big task. The program might feel very different to previous classes and learning environments, and it does not suit every student. However, it might fit you!

The intake process is designed to help you get a better feel for the program in order to decide how well The Wheelhouse will suit YOU. Take the time to ask questions, review materials, and talk as a family in order to make an informed decision about the program.

Giving a quick description of The Wheelhouse program can prove to be a challenge. Sure, we could easily tell you about the five core components, fill you in on the cool community learning days, and about our cool classroom. Even after you learn about all of these things, you may not quite have a good picture of what it would be like to be in The Wheelhouse. However, as you go through the intake process, you will be able to develop a sense as to whether or not The Wheelhouse would be a good fit for you.

How to Register for The Wheelhouse

1. **Review the materials posted online** to learn about The Wheelhouse program at wheelhouse.sd42.ca

2. **Complete an Intake Package** (this document!)

3. **Participate in a small-group Zoom interview:** Typically 2-3 students and their families, with Julie Cornell. Select interview time at wheelhouse.sd42.ca.

4. **Register Online:** Registration opens online at noon on Wednesday, February 10, 2020

Registration Link is posted online at sd42.ca and wheelhouse.sd42.ca.
Applicants should have completed their small-group interview and submitted a completed Intake Package prior to registering.

How many students will be accepted into the program for this year?

This always depends upon the number of current grade 6 students who decide to continue through into grade 7. It is likely that there will be between 5-15 spots available for new students.

Can students start the program in Grade 7, or do they have to begin in Grade 6?

Students new to The Wheelhouse can begin in either grade 6 or grade 7.

If students begin in Grade 6, are they required to stay in the program for Grade 7 as well?

Not at all! However, students who do remain in the program for two full years often experience the most significant positive growth. It is amazing what can happen in just two years !

How are students selected to be in the program?

Students will be accepted in the order of their registration. A waitlist will be created for those who are not initially offered a place. Students placed on the waitlist are often admitted to the program.

What does LEARNING look like in The Wheelhouse?	What does it take for students to SUCCESSFUL ?
We believe that deep learning comes from questioning what we already know and what we believe	→ Ask thoughtful questions, probe new ideas to deepen understanding and question prior knowledge
We believe that it takes effort and drive to be a successful learner	→ Invest time and effort into learning
We are interested in the world beyond our classroom	→ Be passionate about the world around you
We get hints to help us figure things out, but often are not told exactly what we need to do	→ Persevere...when the going gets tough, dig deeper
We are expected to take responsibility and have ownership of our learning	→ Be ready to increase independence, make choices, and to take the initiative to learn

We have a strong and supportive classroom community that we value	→ Show care, compassion and be inclusive
We are expected to be responsible for ourselves	→ Act with respect, maturity and individual integrity
We appreciate everyone's uniqueness	→ Be sensitive and show empathy
We take on many leadership roles both in the classroom and around the school	→ Use good manners, be courteous, kind, sensitive and an all-around positive role model
We are expected to solve problems together	→ Listen carefully to others and aim for solutions that fit everyone as best as possible
We learn better when we support and help each other	→ Be willing to give support and accept guidance from your peers
We believe that everyone deserves to be heard	→ Share your opinions and ideas as well as show respect and appreciation for the ideas of others
We understand that everyone learns differently	→ Understand that fair does not mean equal

We celebrate our growth and the journeys we take together as we learn...	→ Recognize that winning is not often the goal
When we use our brains well, we can feel them stretching and growing as we learn	→ Be ready for regular brain workouts
We know that we will not always have the answers as important steps in our learning	→ Be willing to celebrate others when they shine
We don't always know, and that can feel uncomfortable	→ Accept mistakes and failures as opportunities to grow and learn
	→ Persevere and try to figure things out for yourself before you ask for help or answers

All sorts of students have been successful in The Wheelhouse program. Read through these descriptions about what it is like to be a Wheelhouse student.

Are you flexible in your thinking and mindset?

What does FLEXIBLE look like in The Wheelhouse?	What does it take for students to SUCCESSFUL ?
We often learn in groups or teams	→ Be willing to compromise to accommodate others
We have a flexible schedule that can change during the day in response to our progress, needs, etc.	→ Adapt when unexpected changes occur
It is common for there to be more questions than answers	→ Be comfortable with 'not knowing'
We are challenged outside of our comfort zone	→ Be willing to take risks and stretch your thinking
We have a flexible learning environment: the classroom layout and seating often changes during the day	→ Be flexible in an ever-changing environment
We share our thinking and ideas often to help develop our understanding	→ Consider other people's viewpoints and perspectives before drawing a conclusion

Note: You will not be judged on your responses. We request your input in order to help understand you better. The more we know about you, the more we can help you in determining if The Wheelhouse program will be a good “fit” for you. Please be as honest and detailed as possible – it’s better to tell more, than to leave things out. Thank-you for your input!
